### What to do if your child tests positive during the Christmas holidays:

I am sure you are looking forward to the Christmas break and spending time with the family. Having that time to relax and recharge batteries will be beneficial to all of us. During the holidays, our school still has a responsibility to track COVID cases and inform parents if there is a need to isolate. Therefore, I just wanted to clarify what you should do if your child tests positive for COVID-19 during the break. There is a quick turnaround for booking a test and getting the result so please do not hesitate to book one if you or your child has any of the COVID-19 symptoms. Test centres will be open throughout the Christmas and New Year period.

### Saturday 19th - Sunday 20th December:

If your child develops any COVID symptoms, please take them for a test. Your whole household will need to isolate until the test results are back. Please email the school office on <a href="mailto:admin@ourladys.herts.sch.uk">admin@ourladys.herts.sch.uk</a> to let us know that you are taking your child for a test. You will also need to email the office when your test results come back - whether they are positive or negative.

#### Monday 21st December - Thursday 24th December:

If you are waiting for Covid test results for your child, please let the school office know when the results return

## 27th December - 3rd January:

If your child develops symptoms and has a positive test during this time, please let the school office know – they will not be able to return to school on the 5<sup>th</sup> January.

# **Travelling Abroad:**

If you are travelling abroad during the Christmas period and return to the UK after Christmas day, unless it is a country in a travel corridor, you must self-isolate for 10 full days after you arrive back. Your child must not return to school until the 10-day isolation is complete. If you are using the Test to Release Scheme, please send a copy of your test result to the school office before your child returns to school.
