#### **End of Year Reports:**



Due to the school closures in the spring term, we made the strategic decision of holding back on sending our children's reports out until the end of what has been an extraordinary and unprecedented year. We are very aware that many parents and carers are keen to understand what impact the events of the past year have had on their child's education. In order to minimise the impact on children's learning, we have been working hard throughout the summer term 'bridging work' and

building new pathways to learning by making links between previous learning, lockdown learning and new learning.

We are very keen to share your child's progress with you and share in the successes of the 'recovery' strategies that we have put in place. Reports will be handed out to families on **Wednesday 14**<sup>th</sup> **July, 2021**.

#### **Summer Term Parent Questionnaires:**



As part of our on-going self-evaluation and review, we are continually looking at everything to do with the quality of provision at our school, including teaching and learning, our Catholic values and ethos and the safeguarding and well-being of our children (especially post-lockdown). As you know, we recently asked parents and carers to respond to an online questionnaire about their views of our school. We have analysed the responses and are now using the information received to celebrate what we do well and to

identify those areas that we need to develop or improve in order to make the school an even better place for our children. We are really pleased to share the following headline results with you:

- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is happy at our school.
- 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child feels safe.
- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is well looked after at school.
- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that our school is well led and managed.
- ▶ 98% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is taught well at our school.
- ➤ 98% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is making good progress at school.
- ▶ 98% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that pupils are well behaved at our school.
- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that their child is offered a distinctively Catholic education.
- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that there are strong links between the school and the Parish.
- ➤ 100% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that they would recommend our school to other parents/carers.

# Here are some of the 'headline' comments that our parents/carers made about our school:

- > The school has a really welcoming environment.
- ➤ The school is led very effectively by the leadership team.
- All families feel like they are part of a special community.
- > Teaching staff are amazing at what they do and have really gone the extra mile this year.
- Everybody is well mannered and very respectful.
- ➤ The school creates a nurturing and innovative environment that encourages each child to be the best they can be both academically and as a person.
- My children are extremely happy here.
- ➤ The support that my child has received, who has additional needs, goes above and beyond what other schools do.
- > Children's behaviour is fantastic.
- > The school offers a wonderful Catholic education and is very spiritual.

# Here are some of the ways that parents/carers feel our school could be improved:

- Please just carry on doing what you are doing!
- Communication about key dates could be sent earlier.
- School lunches are not always of the highest quality.
- 'Wraparound' care providing an after school club that runs to 6pm (to run alongside our breakfast club).
- Providing a wider range of after school clubs, as opposed to just sporting clubs (e.g. art, music, etc).
- Proving increasing levels of challenge for some children.

An immediate action to report to you is that, based on feedback in the questionnaires, we are sending out an initial consultation to gauge parental interest in the provision of 'wraparound' care (e.g. childcare outside of normal school hours, such as breakfast club and an after school club that runs until 6pm). If we feel that there is enough interest in this provision, we will seek to set up a later after school club that can run alongside our current clubs. We are also looking at expanding the range of after school clubs that we are currently providing and are exploring the possibility of starting a drama club, a music club and an art club next year.

We really appreciate each and every one of the parents and carers who took the time to fill out the questionnaire. It is very much appreciated by everyone at the school and I hope that you can see that we take all of your comments and suggestions very seriously as we seek to further improve our provision.
