- To create a climate for success in all aspects of school life for all pupils regardless of their background or ability, by ensuring all children are valued equally and supported to reach their full potential;
- To offer support and signpost services for pupils and families whose first language is not English;
- To ensure that children with special educational needs and disabilities have fair and equal access to all aspects of school life by increasing staff awareness and understanding of equality and its implication on a day to day basis through high-quality CPD and professional dialogue;
- To eradicate prejudice related bullying in relation to the protected characteristics listed in the Equality Act 2010;
- To tackle prejudice and promote understanding in relation to people with disabilities;
- To narrow the gap and diminish the differences in progress and attainment between all key groups of pupils (including disadvantaged, SEND and children of different ethnic backgrounds);
- To ensure that our curriculum provision for relationships and sex education matches the requirements from the newly updated Religious Education curriculum;
- To continually reflect and evaluate how well the school ensures equality of opportunities for all its pupils across a broad and balanced curriculum.
